Introduction by Terry on the overview of AB 109 and discussion on Day Reporting Center.

- Dave-HRN does independent assessments and looks at each client's needs, including housing, referrals to other agencies, etc.
- Noel-BH/AOD they have currently seen 5 individuals that fall under AB 109 for services. The free services offered are crisis and the wellness center; if they need telepsych, it is around \$600 per session.
- Ann-AOD feels that with AB 109 reform still changing, we need to look at how we can share information and track our failures and successes. Also, how about group treatment programs, there may be several options.
- Ann-MH-Currently inmates get 1 crisis visit in jail. They need to have insurance to cover other therapeutic services beyond that point. They can join a drop in group; costs associated with mental health treatment to increase.
- Marlinda-Wellness Center, MOST (Milestone Outreach Support Team), to join Milestones a membership agreement is required.
- Ann-MH-may need to develop a reintegration program, may look like the day reporting center model.
