**AGRICULTURE/SEALER**

#### **GENERAL SERVICES/SOLID WASTE**

- 7.21 On motion of Supervisor Morris, seconded by Supervisor Reiss and carried, approves Amendment No. 04-318.1 with West Coast Data Connect, with corrections, extending the existing contract for one year to continue to provide service to install category five cable for Trinity County, in an amount not to exceed maximum amount of \$10,000 from General Fund.
- 7.22 On motion of Supervisor Morris, seconded by Supervisor Reiss and carried, approves Contract No. 05-294 with Purofirst Disaster and Reconstruction Specialists providing emergency water damage clean up at the Trinity County Courthouse due to a faulty sprinkler head occurring on June 17, 2005, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 from Building and Grounds Maintenance of Structures.

- 7.31 On motion of Supervisor Reiss, seconded by Supervisor Chambers and carried, approves Amendment No. 02-384.3 to contract with Wendy Strickler, to provide learning disability evaluations for CalWORKS participants, in the maximum amount of \$30,700 from Health and Human Services CalWORKS Allocation.
- 7.32 On motion of Supervisor Reiss, seconded by Supervisor Chambers and carried, approves Contract No. 05-286 with Southern Trinity Unified School District to reimburse mileage on school vehicles during transportation of at-risk students by Americorps Volunteers, in the maximum amount of \$1,000 from the State Department of Social Services.

- 7.40 On motion of Supervisor Jaegel, seconded by Supervisor Reiss and carried, authorizes Planning Director to sign Contract No. 05-288 with Mintier and Associates to develop work plan for updating the County's General Plan and Community plans, in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 from Planning Department Budget and Transportation Commission Budget. Comments received from Colleen O'Sullivan.
- 7.41 On motion of Supervisor Morris, seconded by Supervisor Reiss and carried, ratifies Planning Directors signature on Amendment No. 03-051.2, to existing Grant Agreement, which provides for an additional \$270,178 to be expended on the design, permitting and preparation for implementation of additional fish-passage improvement projects within the Counties of Del Norte, Humboldt, Mendocino, Siskiyou and Trinity.
- 7.42 Reviews response options to the North Coast Integrated Regional Water Management Plan Phase I and chooses Option No. 1 with the following vote:

- 7.44 On motion of Supervisor Reiss, seconded by Supervisor Chambers and carried, directs the Transportation Department to proceed in the process of considering vacating all of Fairview Marina Road #171, the southerly 1.21 miles of Rainier Road #134, the last (north) 2.3 miles of Canyon Creek Road #401, Terminate Maintenance on the southerly 0.18 miles and vacate the next 1.83 miles of Bear Creek Loop #137 and accept into the County maintained road system approximately 0.5 miles of Forest Service road 5N21 off the end of Friedrich Road and the first mile of Forest Service road 3N10 Pelletreau Road.
