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Trinity County Coronavirus (COVID-19) Health Advisory

TRINITY COUNTY – Trinity County Public Health Branch (TCPHB) has been informed by members of the public of an issue with the MyTurn system in which persons are being turned away from registering for their second dose.

The following individuals will be able to make an appointment once the system is up sometime late today:

- Those 65 years of age and older
- Those in the following sectors
 - Emergency services, this includes law enforcement/CHP
 - Education and childcare
 - Food and agriculture

Those who received their first dose through a TCPHB Point of Distribution Site (PODS) that are 18-64 years of age with chronic health conditions that put them at increased risk may not be able, at this time, to secure an appointment through the MyTurn system. Any persons who have had their first dose of COVID-19 Moderna vaccine given at a TCPHB PODS and are unable to make an appointment through the MyTurn system, please call the COVID-19 Vaccine line at 623-8235 and you will be provided with an appointment time for your second dose.

We are also working with MyTurn to open up registration for the remaining second dose PODS beyond March 6, 2021.



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Not Eligible for Vaccination at TCPHB Mass Vax PODS

For safety reasons we will not be vaccinating persons that have any of the following at our COVID-19 Mass Vax PODS:

- Persons who had an allergic reaction to their first dose of Moderna COVID-19 that resulted in itching, hives, chest tightening, swollen tongue, difficulty breathing, or anxiety
- Pregnant women.

These persons should seek vaccine from their medical provider when it becomes available.

COVID-19 Vaccine cannot be given within 14 days of administration of ANY vaccine. Persons must wait until 14 days have passed since receiving ANY vaccine before COVID-19 vaccine can be administered.
