Trinity County Coronavirus (COVID-19) Health Advisory

TRINITY COUNTY – On March 24, 2021, with the recent decline in case and test positivity rates, Trinity County has moved into the Blueprint Orange Tier. All sectors should refer to the Blueprint for a Safer Economy page on the COVID-19 state website for the guidance under the orange tier at <https://covid19.ca.gov/safer-economy/>

The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) conducts weekly assessment of county case and test positivity trends, if our adjusted case rate and/or test positivity has fallen within a less restrictive tier for two consecutive weekly periods, Trinity County can revert to the less restrictive tier. The following changes to sectors from red to orange tier include but are not limited to:

- Restaurants:
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Capacity must be limited to 50% or 200 people, whichever is less
- Wineries and tasting rooms:
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Capacity must be limited to 25% or 100 people, whichever is less

- Bars, breweries, and distilleries:
 - Outdoor only with modifications

- Retail
 - Indoor operations are permitted at full capacity and retailers must follow the CDPH guidance found at <https://files.covid19.ca.gov/pdf/guidance-retail--en.pdf>

- Places of Worship
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Indoor activities must be limited to 50% of capacity or 200 people, whichever is less

- Hotels, Resorts, Lodging Entities
 - Open with modifications
 - Fitness centers can open to 25% capacity
 - Indoor pools can open
 - Hot tubs, saunas, and steam rooms must remain closed

- Gyms and Fitness Centers
 - Indoor with modifications
 - Capacity must be limited to 25%
 - Indoor pools can open
 - Hot tubs, saunas, and steam rooms must remain closed
 - Climbing walls can open
