Trinity County Coronavirus (COVID-19) Health Advisory

TRINITY COUNTY – Trinity County Public Health Branch (TCPHB) has seen a rapid and exponential increase in cases of COVID-19, with 71 confirmed cases added in the last 3 weeks, and a continued average total of 3-10 cases per day

Overall there continues to be the greatest disease burden in unvaccinated persons in Trinity County; of the 71 cases 83% are unvaccinated. Age breakout of cases are as follows:

- 5 ages 0-17
- 18 ages 18-30
- 21 ages 31-49
- 12 ages 50-64
- 9 ages 65-79
- 4 ages 80+
- 2 ages unknown

Recommendations

We are recommending the following to curb the increasing community spread of COVID-19 in Trinity County:

- Get vaccinated, COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective against severe illness, hospitalization, and “long-Covid”. Vaccines are available at the following locations:

- Wear a mask in public and when indoors, even if vaccinated, when around others whose vaccination status is unknown; this includes businesses, government agencies, meetings, public and private gatherings.

 - If you are concerned that you have been exposed:
 - Quarantine if you have been in close contact (within 6 feet of someone for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period) with someone who has symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or has tested positive, unless you have been fully vaccinated. People who are fully vaccinated do NOT need to quarantine after contact with someone who had COVID-19 unless they have symptoms. However, fully vaccinated people should get tested 3-5 days after their exposure, even if they don't have symptoms and wear a mask indoors in public for 14 days following exposure or until their test result is negative.

 - If you have symptoms that are consistent with COVID-19 get tested:
 - Symptoms include but are not limited to one or more of the following:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
