a. Q&A-5-minutes	Rand Khasawneh and Liam Gogan engage in a conversation about the difficulties faced by low-income families in accessing nutritious food. They emphasize the influence of affordability on food choices and the absence of limitations on unhealthy purchases made through EBT programs. The discussion also touches on the disparity in the cost of healthier foods compared to less nutritious options.	
3. Melissa Avila, School-Dental Program Report-5 minutes a. Q&A-5 minutes	Discussion on School Dental Van and Program Updates Melissa Avila shares positive updates on the school dental van on track for completion of fabrication for January 2025; moreover, highlighting successful screenings, sealant placements, and partnerships with Center for Oral Health. The conversation also addresses the use of passive consents for KOHA screenings.	* Melissa Avila and Megan will continue to work on developing partnerships and resources for oral health programs in schools.
4. Community Oral Health Needs Assessment- 25 minutes	Reviewing Oral Health Program Objectives and Assessing Program Effectiveness Laura Farneti, the LOHP Program Coordinator, shared a rubric and visual representation of the program's objectives. The group engaged in a discussion about assessing the program's effectiveness, including the need for enforcing policy and regulations related to oral health. They also discussed the availability of data and the challenges in ranking the program's performance in assessing and monitoring oral health. Discussion on Medi-Cal Utilization and Data Access Laura Farneti provides insights into the Medi-Cal utilization data from 2021 and the challenges of accessing county-specific data. The group members share their views on the current program level, with some expressing concerns about	



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	limited data access and others considering potential future data sources from school screenings.	
	Laura, the LOHP Program Coordinator, presents data on untreated decay in kindergartners and highlights the challenges in accessing dental care, including long wait times for appointments. Community members express concerns about the lack of priority given to oral health and the difficulty in accessing dental services. The group also discusses the need to improve communication and engagement with parents to better understand their perspectives on oral health.	
	Discussion on Local Dental Providers and Services Laura Farneti and Melissa Avila discussed the positive impact of external partners like the Center for Oral Health in providing dental screenings and bringing opportunities for residents in local clinics. The addition of a dentist at the Mad River location was highlighted as good news.	
	Discussion on Policies and Programs for Oral Health Laura Farneti, the LOHP Program Coordinator, led a discussion on evaluating and implementing policies and programs to support state and community oral health efforts. The participants shared their opinions on the current status of policies and programs, emphasizing the need for more support and implementation in certain areas. The conversation also touched on the overlap with other goals of PATH and the importance of strengthening ties and messaging to improve oral health.
